#### CHURCH IN ACTION

A few years ago, St Patrick's parish was approached by the Local Authority to enquire if we would be available/willing to be a "Place of Safety" in case of emergency in the city/local area. Previously, we have never been called upon until last Thursday morning when, at 7.00am, Amelia received a phone call from the council requesting the church be used for this service.

A fire had broken out in a high-rise block of flats in Barton Hill and at 7.30am, 2 police officers arrived at the church, closely followed by ambulances and Local Authority personnel, including the Mayor of Bristol, Marvin Rees, and residents who had been directed to us.

Parish staff and volunteers jumped into action, the first being Diane McGuinness who opened the church in readiness to receive evacuees. Parish Secretary, Diana, shopped on her way to work buying bread and other items for breakfast, then spent the day alongside Tracy, Amelia, Jill Maggs, Emmanuel, Stewart, and Mary Hopper from St. Nicks, feeding, clothing and supporting the evacuees, with the outstanding presence and support from Bristol City Council and local shops and restaurants.


Fr. Richard McKay came to offer support, as his neighbouring parish of St. Nicholas had the same experience a few weeks ago when there was a fire in a block of flats in the Easton area. All day, food and drinks were provided by the parish, the Local Authority, Tescos and a local restaurant for free. The Charity Shop sent clothes, blankets and towels. Michele Marshall came armed with bottled water, supplies for the children and offered invaluable support to the operation. Parish volunteers from our various groups, including Jo Deasey, Jan Lewis, Chris Boateng, Sheila Wakeham and Charron Plumstead, turned up to help. Rev. Nicola Coleman from St Luke's, multifaith chaplains, social workers and interpreters all came to support the residents. It was an incredibly heart-warming and humbling experience to see the whole community pulling together at this difficult time.

Six people were injured and taken to hospital and some were treated for smoke inhalation. Some residents were able to go home by 8pm, others were provided with temporary accommodation.

The excellent response was a credit to the whole community involved and grateful appreciation and thanks go to everyone who supported this operation to help our dear neighbours in need. In a real-life emergency situation, the love of our church-in-action shone through.
