CURRENT NEWS/WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS WEEK

THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Today is Gaudete Sunday, the third Sunday in Advent, when we celebrate the nearness of Christmas. We light the pink candle today and Canon Gregory will wear rose coloured vestments as we continue our spiritual preparation for the birth of Christ. Tomorrow, Monday 12th December, is the feast day of **Our Lady of Guadalupe**, the patron saint of the Americas. At a time in Mexican history when human sacrifices were still remembered, Our Lady appeared to a poor Indian widower called Juan Diego. She appeared in a cloud of light dressed like an Aztec princess to tell Juan to persuade the Bishop of Mexico to build her a chapel. Poor Juan tried to avoid carrying the message but eventually carried roses in his cloak, his tilda, to the Bishop. At the sight of them, the Bishop and his priests fell to their knees as they could see the beautiful picture of Our Lady which had miraculously appeared on the tilda. In a very short time, 9m Indians became Catholics. **St John of the Cross,** considered one of the foremost poets in Spanish, is celebrated on Wednesday, 14th December.
