SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Today is the day we light the second candle on our Advent Wreath which marks the passage of the four weeks of Advent.

Tuesday 6th December, is the feast day of St Nicholas, the original 'Santa Claus'. He was Bishop of Myra, Asia Minor, in the fourth century and perhaps the best known story attached to him is how he secretly put gold coins through a poor mans window so that his three daughters would have dowries to get married. We remember this story when we buy gold chocolate coins for children at Christmas. Thursday, 8th December is the feast day of the Solemnity of the **Immaculate Conception** of the Blessed Virgin Mary, principal patron of the diocese. 'Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee' is the greeting from the Angel Gabriel to Mary, with the word 'Hail' also translated as 'Rejoice'.
