**CURRENT NEWS/WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS WEEK**

**SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

On Tuesday, 14<sup>th</sup> February, **St Valentine** shares his feast day with two Greek brothers who were made co-patrons of Europe by Pope John Paul II. **Saints Cyril and Methodius** were born in Thessalonica but became missionaries, teachers and patrons of the Slavic people. St Cyril invented an alphabet, still used in some Eastern liturgies. His followers probably formed the Cyrillic alphabet. Together, the brothers translated the Gospels, Paul's letters and liturgical books into Slavonic.

Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> February is the feast day of **St Gilbert of Sempringham**, Lincolnshire. As a young man he inherited a fortune but shared as much as possible with the poor. He founded a religious order called the Gilbertines who lived next to his church. A special custom grew up called "*the plate of the Lord Jesus*", in which the best portions of dinners were put on a plate and shared with the poor. Although he lived very frugally, he lived to be well over 100 when he died in 1189.

The seven founders of the **Servite Order** are remembered on Friday, 17<sup>th</sup> February. In 1240, seven noblemen of Florence decided to lead a life of penance and prayer and adopted the name of the Servants of Mary, or Servites. They combined their life of prayer and silence with teaching and preaching.
