SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

This week marks the beginning of Lent with **Ash Wednesday** on Wednesday, 22nd January, a day of fasting and abstinence. It is also the day we start the Parish Mission – please see the programme for full details of the five-day Mission.

Ash Wednesday also marks the feast of the **Chair of St Peter**. It commemorates Christ's choosing Peter to sit in his place as the servant-authority of the whole Church.

Tomorrow, Monday 20th February, is the feast day of **Saints Jacinta and Francisco Marto**, two of the three young shepherd children who received apparitions of the Virgin Mary at Fatima in 2017. Up to 20 million people a year visit the shrine of Our Lady of Fatima in Portugal. Our lady requested people to pray for world peace, for sinners and for the conversion of Russia.
