#### FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Prayer, fasting and almsgiving are the themes of Lent which started on Ash Wednesday. Today is called Quadragesima Sunday, it means that there are exactly 40 days until Good Friday. Wednesday, 1<sup>st</sup> March, is the feast day of **St David**, patron of Wales. He was a monk of the 6<sup>th</sup> century and founded ten monasteries, including Glastonbury. We wish Abbot David Charlesworth a very happy feast day.

On Saturday, 4<sup>th</sup> March, it is the feast of **St Casimir**, prince of Poland, who was born in Krakow in 1458. He died at the age of 26 and miracles were soon reported at his tomb. His help was claimed by Lithuanians whose patron he became in conflicts with the Russians.

# THE STORY OF ALBRECHT DURER'S 'PRAYING HANDS'



There were two brothers, Franz and Albrecht, who were very talented and longed for careers as artists. They came from a large family who were very poor and unable to pay for their studies.

One day Albrecht said to Franz:' Why don't we take turns to study painting, whilst the other earns the money to pay for it. That way we can both become artists'. Franz agreed, but only if Albrecht, the younger of the two, studied first because he was the better artist.

Albrecht studied hard under the great masters while Franz laboured to keep them both. When Albrecht finished his studies, he returned home joyfully to tell Franz it was now his turn. But when Franz held out his hands they were gnarled and calloused, the hands of a worker unable even to hold a pencil, useless to an artist. Albrecht was grief stricken. There is only one thing I can do now to repay you. I shall draw a picture that will speak to people's hearts – a picture of these hands of sacrifice and love.

Four hundred years later the picture of the 'Praying Hands' is known and loved all over the world. Albrecht Durer became one of Germany's greatest painters, but his brother to whom he owed his success, whose hands are forever famous, is almost forgotten.
