#### THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

**Blessed Angela Sawala** was born in Siepraw, Krakow, in 1881. At the age of 17, during World War 1, she helped prisoners of war without regard for the nationality or religion.

**St Patrick's Day**, Friday 17 March, will be a great day for our church as we celebrate the feast day of our patron saint. He was born in Britain in 390 somewhere between the mouth of the Severn and the River Clyde, in the north. As a youth, he was captured by Irish pirates and sold into slavery for six years. His writings show a sincere simplicity and deep pastoral care devoted to abolishing paganism, idolatry and sun worship.

# 9 INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT ST PATRICK'S DAY

- 1. St Patrick did not wear green. His colour was" St Patrick's blue". The colour green became associated with St Patrick's Day after it was lined to the Irish independence movement in the late 18<sup>th</sup> century.
- 2. Despite his Irish notoriety, St Patrick was British. He was born to Roman parents in Scotland or Wales in the late fourth century.
- 3. According to Irish legend, St Patrick used the shamrock as a metaphor for the Holy Trinity when he was first introducing Christianity to Ireland.
- 4. Saint Patrick is credited for driving the snakes out of Ireland, but according to the fossil record, Ireland has never been home to snakes as it was too cold to host reptiles during the Ice Age. The surrounding seas have kept snakes out since.
- 5. There is not any corn in the traditional St Patrick's Day meal of corned beef and cabbage. The name is a reference to the large grains of salt historically used to cure meats, which were also known as "corns".
- 6. Saint Patrick was born "Maewyn Succal" but changed his name to "Patricius" after becoming a priest.
- 7. Irish immigrants began observing St Patrick's Day in Boston in 1737 and the first St Patrick's Day parade in America was held in New York City in 1766.
- 8. In Chicago, the Plumbers Local 110 Union dyes the river Kelly Green. The dye lasts for around 5 hours.
- 9. On or around St Patrick's Day, the Irish Taoiseach, or prime minister, presents the US president with a crystal bowl of live shamrocks as a symbol of the close ties between the two countries.
