CURRENT NEWS/WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS WEEK

Fourth Sunday of Lent

Today is **Laetare Sunday**, a day of celebration in the season of Lent. Laetare means 'rejoice'. Priests wear rose coloured robes to remind us that the joy of Easter is just 21 days away. Today is also the feast day of **St Joseph.** He is described in the Bible as a 'just man', meaning he was open to all that God wanted him to do. He is the patron saint of families and fathers and was declared Patron of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX.

Wednesday, 22 March: Today we remember one of England's 40 martyrs, **St Nicolas Owen.** Born in Oxford, he spent 20 years building secret hiding places for priests in Britain at a time when Catholics were put to death. He saved hundreds of lives but died under torture in 1606.

Friday, 24 March, marks the day **St Oscar Romero**, Archbishop of San Salvador, was murdered while celebrating Mass in 1980. He had begged police and soldiers to "Cease the repression in the name of Go". 250,000 people attend his funeral.

The **Annunciation of the Lord** is celebrated on Saturday, 25 March. From all eternity, God destined Mary to be the mother of Jesus and a link between heaven and earth. The angel's answer to Mary is "Nothing is impossible with **God".**

- 12 Amazing Facts About St Joseph That You Might Not Know
 March 19 is known as St Joseph Day, or the Solemnity of St Joseph (if celebrated in Lent you can break the Fast).
 In Europe the people dedicate an altar to him, also known as "St Joseph's Table" or "la tavola di San Guiseppe." People decorate it with flowers, candles, wine and "lucky" foods.
 According Date to the Catholic Encyclopaedia, the Apocryphal Date for Joseph's birth is 90BC in Bethlehem and the Apocryphal of his death is July 20, AD18 in Nazareth.

- 4. Workers' Day) since he is the patron of workers.
- 5. Joseph has no recorded words in Scripture.
- 6. Veneration of St Joseph goes back at least to the 9th century. An early title used to honour him was nutritor Domini, meaning "guardian of the Lord."
- 7. He is the patron of the Universal Church, a happy death, families, unborn, fathers, expectant mothers, travellers, immigrants, craftsman, engineers and July 20, AD 18 in Nazareth.
- 8. The Church celebrates two feast days uniquely for St Joseph: March 19 for Joseph the Husband of Mary and May 1 for Joseph the Worker. In 1955 Pope Pius XII established the Feat of "St Joseph the Worker". This is also May Day (International workers. He's also the patron of Sicily, America, Canada, China, Croatia and Mexico.
- 9. It was only in the 20th century that people started to gather the Church's insights about St** Joseph.
- 10. In the 1950's three centres were dedicated to the study of St Joseph.
- 11. It is traditional to wear red on St Joseph's Day.
- 12.He is mentioned in the Canon of the Mass.
