Seventh Sunday of Easter

Tuesday 23 May: Pope St Gregory lived in very dark times for the Church. Early in the eleventh century, a young monk called Hildebrand became Pope Gregory VII and he fiercely opposed the control of Emperor Henry IV over the church. The Gregorian Reform, a milestone in the history of the church, was named after him.

Wednesday 24 May: We remember **St Aldhelm**, **Bishop**, who was a monk at Malmesbury, Wiltshire, before being appointed Abbot. Alfred the Great praised his singing and preaching while the Venerable Bede praised his Latin Scholarship.

Friday 26 May is the feast day of St Philip Neri who, in 1551 was a much sought after confessor, combining good humour and jokes with piety. His epitaph read "Philip Neri, learned and wise, by sharing the pranks of children himself became a child again".
