CURRENT NEWS/WHAT'S HAPPENING THIS WEEK

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Today, Sunday, is the feast day of **St Rose Venerini** who was born in Italy in 1656. After her fiancé died, Rose opened the first public school for girls in Italy. Because of its success, she was invited to open more. In 1718, Pope Clement XI and eight cardinals visited and he told her "Signora Rosa, with these schools you will sanctify Rome".

Tuesday 9th May: Not many people can count six saints as their best friends but **St John of Avila** was no ordinary man. He was left a fortune which he gave to the poor. He was friends with Saints Francis Borgia, Ignatius of Loyala, John of God, John of the Cross, Peter of Alcantara and Teresa of Avila.

Wednesday 10th May: **St Damian of Belgium** was born in 1840 and volunteered to take the place of his sick brother as a minister in a leper colony in Hawaii. He lived there for 16 years before dying of the disease. Under his guidance, government support was obtained and he built new houses, a church, school and orphanage.

Saturday 13th May is the feast of **Our Lady of Fatima** who appeared to three Portuguese children in 1917 to urge the world to pray.

COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS

Receiving both the Body and Blood of Christ, i.e, 'communion under both kinds' has been an option in our own parishes for many years but, sadly, the COVID-19 pandemic gave rise to very legitimate concerns about distribution under both species and therefore dioceses and parishes worldwide stopped offering communion under both kinds. Now, thankfully, after an absence of over two years, the Bishops of England and Wales have decided that we will be able, once again, to start offering the opportunity to receive the precious Blood from the Chalice during Mass. Put simply, Jesus said "take and eat' take and drink...". It will, of course, be each individual's choice whether they receive from the chalice or not and, as we know, the Church teaches that the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ is present in both the Sacred Host and Precious Blood, so there is no *obligation* to receive Holy Communion from the chalice.

St Patrick's Church have reintroduced Communion under both kinds from Sunday 30th April at the 10.00 am Mass only. At the end of June Communion under both kinds will be reintroduced at all Masses.
