This week, we celebrate the feast day of **Saints Peter and Paul**, Apostles, on Thursday, 29<sup>th</sup> June. Together, the two saints are the founders of the See of Rome through their ministry, preaching and martyrdom there. It is a **HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION and Mass is at 9.15am and 7.30pm** 

The next day, Friday 30<sup>th</sup> June, it is the **Dedication of the Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul**. To mark the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Clifton Cathedral, the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester will attend a Mass of Thanksgiving at 11.00am. All are invited to attend this special occasion.

Saturday, 1<sup>st</sup> July, is the feast day of **St Oliver Plunkett**. He was born in Ireland in 1629 and became Bishop of Armagh. He was brought to London on charges of treason and executed in Tyburn. His body rests in Downside Abbey.


