# TWENTY FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Thursday, 27<sup>th</sup> September, is the feast day of **St Vincent de Paul** who was born in France in 1580. He worked with the poor and the sick and organised rich people of Paris to pay for missionary projects including several hospitals and ransoming 1,200 galley slaves from North Africa. The Society of St Vincent de Paul was founded 200 years after his death, and he is the patron saint of all charitable societies.

'Good' **King Wenceslaus** is remembered on Friday – he is the patron saint of Bohemia. Friday is also the feast day of **St Lawrence Ruiz**, martyred for the faith in 1637. He is the first Filipino martyr.

On Saturday, 29<sup>th</sup> September, it is the feast day of **Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael**. Angels – messengers from God – appear frequently in Scripture but only Michael, Gabriel and Raphael are named.

**HARVEST SUNDAY:** Today we mark this festival of thanksgiving to celebrate the harvest and food grown on the land in the United Kingdom. It is about giving thanks for a successful crop yield over the year as winter starts to approach. We welcome pupils from St Patrick's School at the 10am Mass and thank them for their participation in this festival.

The second collection this week is in aid of **Evangelii Gaudium Sunday**, formerly known as Home Mission Sunday, to support new ways of proclaiming the faith and reaching out to others.

**<u>RIP CANON KEVIN KENNY</u>**: Canon Kevin, one of Canon Gregory's oldest friends and a frequent visitor to St Patricks, died peacefully in Preston Hospital on 15<sup>th</sup> September after a short illness aged 86. He was a parish priest in the Salford Diocese and had also been a Canon of the Holy Sepulchre in Northern England. He only retired as prior of the order five years ago after 42 years of service. He once wrote: "One of the greatest blessings of my priestly life has been to serve the Holy Land." Canon Gregory was able to visit Fr Kevin in hospital shortly before he died. It was a great joy that he and Father Aldo preached our centenary retreat in Lent earlier this year.

Canon Kevin's ashes will be inurned here in St Patrick's in a special Mass in November when we will all have the opportunity to pay our respects. It is nice to think he chose St Patrick's to be his final resting place.

In his letter of sympathy to Canon Gregory last Friday Chris Boateng wrote "A great tree has fallen so it is a heavy loss for St Patricks and the entire catholic church. May the soul of Canon Kevin Kenny rest in perfect peace in the bosom of the Almighty until the Day of Resurrection when we shall meet again."
