TWENTY EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today is the feast day of **St Teresa of Avila**. She was born in the 16th century, an age of social and religious upheaval. She founded more than six monasteries and her writings, especially *The Way of Perfection*, have helped generations of Believers.

Tomorrow, Monday, is the feast day of **St Hedwig of Bavaria**. At the age of 12, she married the Count of Bavaria. She had seven children and founded many hostels for the sick. After her husband's death, she became a Cistercian nun.

On Wednesday, 18th October, we remember **St Luke the Apostle** on his feast day. He was a Greek physician and is the author of the third Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY: We celebrate World Mission Sunday next week on 22nd October. Donations are collected at the worldwide Masses, and they go, in their entirety, to support churches, hospitals, schools and vocations in countries where the Church is new, young or poor.

On October 12th, the day of Our Lady of Aparecida, the patron saint of Brazil, is celebrated. This date has been a national holiday in Brazil since 1980, when Pope John Paul II consecrated the basilica, which is the fourth most visited Marian shrine in the world. From Monday the 9th to Saturday the 14th of October, the Brazilian parishioners of St Patricks prayed the Rosary online in preparation for Her Celebration on Sunday the 15th (today), which will begin with a procession in Dillon Court.

It was great to see 200 people at the Brazilian First Holy Communion Mass last Sunday. Everyone enjoyed the beautiful liturgy and the great party in the Brooks Hall following the event. Congratulations to the nine children who made their First Holy Communion.
