THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Tuesday, 14th November: Today we remember all the beatified **Martyrs of the Diocese**. Thursday, 16th November, is the feast day of **St Edmund of Abingdon** who is the patron saint of our recently formed Deanery. He was a merchant who became a monk and taught arts at Oxford University. He was appointed Archbishop of Canterbury in 1233.

The **Dedication of the Churches of St Peter and St Paul's Outside the Wall** is remembered on Saturday, 18th November. Dedicated to two apostles, St Peter's is probably the most famous Church in the world while St Paul's is built on the site where St Paul was believed to have been beheaded. The two churches, although miles apart, were linked by a roofed colonnade of marble columns for hundreds of years.


BAPTISM
