THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today is the World Day of the Poor. This was established by Pope Francis and first observed in 2017 with the theme “Let us love, not with words, but with deeds”.

Tomorrow, Monday November 20th, is the feast day of **St Rose Philippine Duchesne** who was born in France in 1769. When her convent closed during the French Revolution, she opened a school for homeless children and risked her life helping priests in the underground. Her dream was to work with native Americans, but it was only after many years of hardship in Missouri that she got her lifelong wish working with the Potawatome people where she was given the name Woman Who Always Prays.

Tuesday, 21st November, is the feast day of the **Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary** when Anna and Joachim offered Mary to God in the Temple when she was three years old. This was to carry out a promise made to God when Anna was still childless.

On Friday, we remember **St Andrew Dung-Lac**, Priest and martyr, one of 117 people martyred in Vietnam between 1820 and 1862. They included 50 priests, eight bishops and 59 laymen.
