SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Today is the Second Sunday of Advent and the second candle will be lit on the Advent wreath in Church.

Tuesday, 12th December, is the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Before Mary appeared to a humble peasant, Juan Diego, Spanish missionaries had had little success in converting Mexicans and human sacrifices were still taking place. Mary appeared dressed like an Aztec princess on a hillside and persuaded Juan Diego to tell the Bishop of Mexico to build a chapel on the site where she appeared. As a sign, Juan picked roses which he carried in his cloak to the bishop who fell to his knees at the sight of the beautiful roses with a picture of Mary on the cloak's fabric. Our Lady of Guadalupe is the patron saint of Mexico and America.

The next day, Wednesday, 13th December, is the feast day of St Lucy who was martyred at Syracuse in 304. She is the patron saint of the blind and people with eye disorders.

Blessed Mary Frances Schervier was born in France but visited the United Stated to help her fellow Sisters of the Poor of St Francis to nurse soldiers wounded in the Civil war. She was beatified in 1974 and we remember her on Friday 15th December.



Jim Brooks 1941 – 2023

Please pray for Jim Brooks who died this week. Jim Came to St Patricks parish at the age of four in 1945 and has been a faithful parishioner for 78 years until his death this week. Jim was an alter server, aged seven for Canon Dillon in the early years of the parish. He attended St Patricks school in the forties and fifties and became Chair of Governors of the school. Jim was an architect and he designed St Patrick's church in 1995 and the new extension in 2017. Jim designed the Brooks Hall which is named after him. Jim married Julie 59 years ago in St Patricks and they had three children, Jamie, Catherine, and Clare.

Jamie died ten years ago, and Jim and Julie commissioned the Stained-glass window of St Patricks in the church tower in Jamies memory. Jim was involved in every area of the parish life. St Patricks was his second home and second family.

As we thank God for all Jim contributed to our lives, we pray for him, his wife Julie, their daughters Catherine, and Clare and all their grandchildren.

It is only rarely a parish has the privilege of enjoying a lifetime of service from a parishioner. Jim has been the privilege St Patricks parish for almost 80 years.
