Ordinary Time Week 1

Today, Sunday, we celebrate the **Epiphany of the Lord**, also called the Feast of the Three Kings. It commemorates the visit of the three Magi to the baby Jesus bringing gold, frankincense and myrrh as gifts. Tomorrow is the feast of the **Baptism of the Lord**. Wednesday, 10th January, is the feast day of **St Gregory of Nyssa**, modern day Turkey. He was brought up in a very holy family as he was the son of two saints, Basil and Emmilia and

his older brother was St Basil the Great. He was a professor of rhetoric but was persuaded to devote his learning to the Church.

On Friday, 12th January, we remember **St Aelred of Rievaulx**. In 1143, after being Master of the Royal Household, he became Abbot of Revesby and four years later, Abbot of Rievaulx in Yorkshire.
