## THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Today, Sunday, is the feast day of **St Katherine Drexel who** was born in Philadelphia, USA, in 1858. She was born into a very wealthy family but had always been interested in the plight of the Native Americans. With the support of Pope Leo XIII she founded the order of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, opening a boarding school, black Catholic schools in 13 states, 40 mission centres and 23 rural schools. She founded the Xavier University in New Orleans, the first Catholic university in the United States for African Americans. Tomorrow, Monday, we remember **St Casimir**, prince of Poland, who refused to fight against any Christian country. He was born in Krakow and died in 1484 at the age 0f 26. Miracles were soon reported at his tomb in Vilna and in the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> centuries his help was sought by Lithuanians whose patron he became in their fight against the Russians. Friday, 8<sup>th</sup> March, is the feast day of **St John of God**, the founder of the Brothers Hospitallers. He was born in Portugal in 1495. He was a mercenary fighting against the Turks but turned to God at the age of 40. He is the patron saint of firefighters, heart patients, the sick, hospitals and nurses.

## THE CLEANING OF THE CHURCH

Canon Gregory writes – For the first time in my 35 years as parish priest in St Patrick's I notice that the church is dirty. I would like this to be a source of great shame for all of us. The Lord's house is unclean. Biscuit crumbs in the front row of pews have been there for two weeks. No-one will volunteer to clean the church. We only have one team of 4 volunteers who last cleaned on 9<sup>th</sup> February and will next clean on 2<sup>nd</sup> March. Cleaning the church once a month is not enough.

We need four teams of four people in each team. There are to be two Friday teams and two Saturday teams. Each team cleans once a month. Each clean takes two hours 9.00 - 11.00 am. Joining a cleaning team involves committing yourself to two hours a month, only 24 hours (12 months x 2 hours) a year.

There is a list in the narthex for you to enlist in joining a Cleaning Team. Please volunteer to help keep our church clean. Currently it is a dirty disgrace.
