### **FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**

Today is **Good Shepherd Sunday** and it is the day we pray for vocations around the world.

On Tuesday, 23<sup>rd</sup> April, it is the feast day of **St George**, patron saint of England. He was martyred in 303 AD in Palestine. Legend says that St George killed a dragon to encourage people to believe in Jesus Christ and that 15,000 were baptised in a day. We have a stained-glass window of St George in our church. Tenerife's only saint, **San Pedro de Betancour** is celebrated on Friday. He was a shepherd until the age of 26 when he left the Canary Isles and enrolled in the Jesuit College in Guatemala. During his time there, he opened a school and a hospital for the poor as well as a shelter for the homeless. He died in 1667.


