We will be getting quotes for surveillance cameras, alarms, window locks and external lighting. All of this is going to cost a great deal of money, so we are now beginning an <u>APPEAL FOR SITE SECURITY</u>. Please consider making a donation to the Site Security Appeal Fund. WHO IS CARLO ACUTIS

Carlo Acutis (1991-2006) was a British-born Italian teenager who was beatified by the Catholic Church in 2020. He's often referred to as the "Cyber Apostle of the Eucharist" due to his remarkable devotion to the Eucharist and his use of technology to spread the Gospel.

Carlo is an excellent patron saint for a youth group, especially one focused on technology, the media and faith. His story can inspire young people to:

- 1. *Deepen their faith*: Carlo's love for the Eucharist and his commitment to prayer can encourage young people to nurture their own spiritual lives.
- 2. *Harness technology for good*: Carlo used the internet and multimedia to share the Gospel and promote devotion to the Eucharist, showing that technology can be a powerful tool for evangelization.
- 3. *Live with purpose and passion*: Carlo's short life was marked by a remarkable sense of purpose and passion for his faith, inspiring young people to make the most of their own lives and to become evangelists to all around them.
