Councillor Ed Plowden, Chair of the Transport and Connectivity Committee, said: "We are continuing with the trial scheme because we know, from looking at similar initiatives, that they offer many health benefits and make local roads safer for everyone."

The new Bus Gates will have a significant detrimental effect on our lives here in St Patrick's. Blue Badge Holders who live in the area are advised to look for an exemption. We also suggest Blue Badge Holders who are frequent visitors to St Patrick's also look on the website to see if they are eligible for an exemption to the Bus Gates.
