FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Today is Laetare Sunday, known as Joyful or Rejoice Sunday. It is celebrated on the fourth Sunday of Lent, exactly 21 days before Easter. Rose coloured vestments are worn by the priests, and it is a day of celebration.

Thursday is the feast day of St Benedict the African. His parents were taken as slaves to Sicily, but he was freed at the age of 18. He became novice master in the Franciscan order, then guardian of the friars. When he died King Philip of Spain built him a special tomb.
