JESUS YOUTH (AGED 13-17)

Jesus Youth is an international Catholic movement. GenJ (Generation Jesus) is a monthly gathering for Catholic teens (ages 13–17) in the Bristol area. They run events on the first Friday of every month at St Patrick's Catholic Church, an initiative that began two months ago in September. GenJ is a youth-led missional programme helping young people to grow in prayer, holiness, and joyful discipleship through fellowship, interactive talks, Q&A, praise & worship, and fun activities.

Their aim is simple and urgent: to give teenagers a safe, Jesus-centred space where they can encounter Christ, make friends who encourage virtue, and be formed to live their Catholic faith boldly at school and at home. The meetings run from $6.00 \, \text{pm} - 8.00 \, \text{pm}$.
