REST IN PEACE

Grace Strong, the oldest parishioner in St Patrick's, has died aged 104.

Grace was born in the house lived in by her parents off Church Road, Redfield. When she married her husband, Gilbert, she held her wedding party at her home and died peacefully in her sleep there last week. She is survived by her son, David, his wife Joan and their children - Anthony and Annmarie.

Canon Gregory said: "Grace was an integral part of life in St Patrick's. Her family was the first to attend Mass here when the church was built in 1923, she was one of the first pupils at the school when it opened in 1933 and she worked in St Patrick's Charity Shop for 25 years.

Her nickname was 'Apple Pie Grace' because of the hundreds of pies she baked over the years to support Christmas and Summer fairs. She will be remembered with love and affection."

Grace's body will be brought into St Patrick's Church on Tuesday 17th February at 4.30pm. Her Requiem Mass will take place on Wednesday 18th February at 11.30am, followed by committal at Westerleigh Woodland Chapel at 1.00pm. May Grace Rest in Peace.
